

Yalaha Run

World's Shortest Rallye

The tiny community of Yalaha is home to a famous German bakery, Yalaha Bakery. They are



known for breads and pastries. But they are much more. They have a delicatessen serving breakfast and lunch (from Brauenwurst to Wienerschnitzel). And, out back is an open-air German beer garden with 22 different German beers and live music on the weekends. A visit to the Yalaha Bakery can satisfy multiple gastronomical cravings and create memories and stories to share. Hours are 8:00 am to 7:00 pm.

Rallye instructions are below. The Yalaha Run is a self-guided drive to be scheduled when best for your own agenda.

Outbound

1. **Right** at Stop onto CR 48 at the entrance to the Mission Inn straight through traffic light onto SR 19
2. **Right** at Blinking Light, onto Central Ave. (1.2 miles, Howey Market on corner)

Road name changes to **Number Two Road**, (Continue following Number 2 Rd., through the turns and elevation changes. There is a high point at about 4 miles, where you can stop for a view.)

3. **Right** at Stop onto CR 48
4. **Right** into Yalaha Bakery (1.3 miles)

Enjoy a pastry, sip some coffee, buy a loaf of bread to take home, partake in a full breakfast or lunch, or sample the 22 German beers offered (well, not all of them on one trip).

Return

1. **Right** on CR 48
2. **Right** on Camino Real Blvd. (2.8 miles, Mission Inn Entrance)

This route and instructions are suggested, you are in no way obligated to follow them. Tour carefully, drive responsibly and safely.

General Instructions

GOF South Rallyes and Drives

Introduction

Road Rallyes and Drives are designed to be a fun and enjoyable activity to provide MG enthusiasts an opportunity to experience the thrill of driving their classic car on interesting roads and to quaint destinations in the company of like-minded individuals. They may be run as a self-guided tour or as a group drive or as a competitive event. Being run on public roads, Rallyes and Drives place classic MGs in front of many people, promoting the classic car hobby.

Standards of Rallye Instructions

- ◆ After completing an instruction, continue on that roadway until the next instruction, through bends in the road and road name changes
- ◆ Mileages are estimates, giving an approximated location of a turn
- ◆ Instructions are designed to be clear but brief. They are not intended to be “tricky”

Terminology of Route Instructions

CR - County Road with designated number

Left - Turn left at the point indicated in the instruction

Right - Turn right at the point indicated in the instructions

SR - State Road with designated number

Stop - Octagonal red stop sign

T - A Tee intersection where the road ends into another road, a right or left must be taken to continue

(1.2 miles) – Mileage from previous instruction to the point where this instruction is executed

A Word about Safety

Road Rallyes and Drives are run on public roads with normal traffic. All rules of the road apply during the course of the event. At no time are you expected to, nor should you feel compelled to, violate these rules. If you are confronted with a risky situation you are expected to use good judgment. Always err on the side of safety. You are responsible for your own decisions and assume all responsibility operating a vehicle on public roads.

Bicycles! – The roads in Lake County are popular for bicyclists. Be aware.

Speed Limits – Many of the roads have low speed limits, some as low as 25 mph. Watch your speed.
