

Rallye Route



Boondocks Route

1. Exit Mission Inn parking lot to resort entrance
2. **Right** at stop onto SR 48
Continue straight through traffic light onto SR 19
3. **1st Left** after traffic light onto Citrus Ave. (stone wall on left) (0.8 miles)
Pass Howey Mansion on left, road bends to the right and becomes Camelia Way
4. **Right** at T onto Lakeshore Blvd.
J. B. Boondocks on Left - best option if you have not had lunch (1.0 miles)
Continue on Lakeshore Blvd.
5. **Left** at stop onto SR 19, use caution
6. **Left** onto CR 455 [← Montverde] (1.6 miles)
7. **1st Right** at traffic circle, same as 90° right, onto CR 561
8. **Left** onto Sugarloaf Mountain Rd. (1.3 miles)
9. At the 90° right, **Pull Off** road onto shoulder and park
You are at the Sugarloaf Mountain Summit, stretch your legs and enjoy the view
This is the highest elevation in peninsular Florida – 312 feet above sea level
10. Crank up the MG, **Continue** on Sugarloaf Mt. Rd., following road's turns

11. **Left** at T onto CR 561A
12. **Right** at T onto CR 455
13. **Right** onto 7th Street in Montverde, continuing on CR 455
14. **Right** onto Ridgewood Ave. (1.2 miles)
15. **Right** at Stop onto Fosgate Road
16. **Left** at Stop onto CR 455
17. **2nd Right** at traffic circle (same as straight)
18. **3rd Right** at traffic circle (same as left turn)
19. **Right** at traffic light onto Turnpike Road
20. **Forced Right** onto South Buckhill Road
21. **Left** at Stop onto CR 455
22. **Right** at stop onto SR 19 N
23. Continue **Straight** at traffic light onto CR 48 W
24. **1st Left** into Mission Inn

General Instructions

GOF South Rallyes and Drives

Introduction

Road Rallyes and Drives are designed to be a fun and enjoyable activity to provide MG enthusiasts an opportunity to experience the thrill of driving their classic car on interesting roads and to quaint destinations in the company of like-minded individuals. They may be run as a self-guided tour or as a group drive or as a competitive event. Being run on public roads, Rallyes and Drives place classic MGs in front of many people, promoting the classic car hobby.

Standards of Rallye Instructions

- ◆ After completing an instruction, continue on that roadway until the next instruction, through bends in the road and road name changes
- ◆ Mileages are estimates, giving an approximated location of a turn
- ◆ Instructions are designed to be clear but brief. They are not intended to be “tricky”

Terminology of Route Instructions

CR - County Road with designated number

Left - Turn left at the point indicated in the instruction

Right - Turn right at the point indicated in the instructions

SR - State Road with designated number

Stop - Octagonal red stop sign

T - A Tee intersection where the road ends into another road, a right or left must be taken to continue

(1.2 miles) – Mileage from previous instruction to the point where this instruction is executed

A Word about Safety

Road Rallyes and Drives are run on public roads with normal traffic. All rules of the road apply during the course of the event. At no time are you expected to, nor should you feel compelled to, violate these rules. If you are confronted with a risky situation you are expected to use good judgment. Always err on the side of safety. You are responsible for your own decisions and assume all responsibility operating a vehicle on public roads.

Bicycles! – The roads in Lake County are popular for bicyclists. Be aware.

Speed Limits – Many of the roads have low speed limits, some as low as 25 mph. Watch your speed.
